

## How to become NEXTGEN TV Certified







## Introduction

Certification is in 2 parts; CTA are responsible for the NEXTGEN TV logo, operated on their behalf by Resillion. The ATSC 3 Security Authority (A3SA) are responsible for the certificates and licences necessary to access secured and encrypted services, supported also by Resillion.

Devices must pass all applicable tests in the NEXTGEN TV Test Suite and A3SA Test Suite to be certified. Stakeholders may register to view the contents of the NEXTGEN TV test suite at https://atsc3.cta.tech

The tests reference ATSC Specifications at atsc.org and CTA Receiver Guidelines at cta.tech, and implementers are cautioned that services may go beyond the scope of the test suites. The test coverage is extended through annual releases, to cover updates to the specifications and address any gaps. All stakeholders are encouraged to contribute to this process through the portal issue tracker or ATSC Implementation Team 3: Conformance.

## Steps to get the NEXTGEN TV Logo

- 1. Contact Resillion to license NEXTGEN TV test suite, or arrange for our lab in Shenzhen to test your device
- 2. Contact CTA to obtain the Logo Licence Agreement
- 3. Complete self-test or lab-testing to obtain your NEXTGEN Certification Statement
- 4. Submit Certification Statement to CTA for audit

## Steps to A3SA Service Security and DRM Certification

- 1. Contact A3SA to obtain the A3SA Adopter Agreement
- 2. Contact Resillion to obtain your A3SA **Test Suite Support Agreement**
- 3. Complete self-test or lab-testing to obtain your A3SA Certification Statement
- 4. Submit Certification Statement to A3SA for audit
